#### **Executive Summary**

According to the Debt for Development Swap Agreement signed on June 3, 2007 between the Government of Italy and the Government of Egypt, this report presents the progress of the Italian-Egyptian Debt for Development Swap Program Phase II, for the year 2009, as per article n. 6.2 of the Agreement.

Up to December 31, 2009, a total amount of \$80,145,229.30 - out of the \$100 million covered by the Agreement - has been converted and the equivalent LE 443,928,765.36 credited to the Counterpart Fund (CPF) account opened at the Central Bank of Egypt.

The amount of LE 23,227,676.32 (\$ 4,070,818.29) has been transferred from the CPF to the projects' accounts for projects implementation and to the Technical Support Unit (TSU) for its running costs and technical assistance activities, leaving a balance of LE 420,701,089.04 (almost \$ 76 million) on the CPF.

Thirteen initiatives have been so far approved, out of which five are currently in the implementation phase (ICED, WFP, NWRC, NCCM, UNDP) and eight are about to start their activities.

Nineteen initiatives are currently in the formulation / negotiation phase.

Projects identified and approved are in line with the Egyptian Reform Agenda and with the priorities of the 5<sup>th</sup> Year Economic and Social Development Plan 2007/2012 and focus on five main sectors of intervention: 1) Human Resources Development; 2) Transfer of Technology and Upgrading Innovation Centers; 3) Primary Production Promotion, Organization and Logistics; 4) Natural Resources Protection and Management; 5) Social Development.

Applicants and Implementing Agencies are composed of Egyptian Ministries and Public Institutions, International organizations, Egyptian and Italian NGOs.

#### 1. Financial situation

#### 1.1 CPF Status as of 31st of December 2009

As of December 31, 2009, \$ 80,145,229.30, out of the 100 million debt amount subject to the Agreement, has been converted and the equivalent in Egyptian Pound, equal to LE 443,928,765.36, has been credited to the Counterpart Fund.

At the same date, **LE 23,227,676.32** (\$ 4,070,817.29) have been transferred from the CPF, out of which **LE 20,279,522.69** (\$ 3,554,132.17) have been transferred to the projects accounts for projects implementation and **LE 2.948.153.63** (\$ 516,685.12) have been transferred to the TSU for running costs and technical assistance activities.

According to Artigiancassa statements, as of December 31, 2009, the total debt canceled, as per the procedures established by the Agreement, amounts to \$4,070,817.29 (equal to LE 23,227,676.32).

The available balance on the CPF is **LE 420,701,089.04** (\$ 76,074,412.01).

Debt yet to be converted is \$ 19,854,770.70.

#### 1.2 Projects financial status

As of December 31, 2009, the Management Committee has approved 13 projects for an overall commitment of **LE 159,538,618.00** (about \$ 29 million¹) which represents almost 36% of the total funds converted and credited to the CPF at the same date.

The total amount of installments transferred to the approved projects is **LE 20,279,522.69** equal to \$3,554,132.17.

As for projects' expenditures, at December 31, 2009, the total disbursement by the projects amounts to **LE 4,769,223.48** (about \$ 867,000<sup>2</sup>) representing about the **23.5%** of the related funds transferred to those projects.



The project aims at creating low-cost jobs in the field of solid-waste management and improving environmental conditions in Manshiet Nasser and Ezbet El-Nakhl areas in Cairo. To that end, the project will upgrade the recycling workshops in the target area and introduce more efficient techniques and technologies in order to create new permanent jobs in the sector and reduce gas and liquid emissions of the recycling process.

So far, the project received two installments for a total amount of LE 1,260,000.00 (\$ 229,090.91) and implementation is in line with approved plan.
